this study examines one aspect of american women s professionalization and the implications of the cross cultural dialogue between american woman missionaries and japanese students and supporters at kobe college between 1873 and 1909

this collection of historical and contemporary writing by women argues that in addition to gender identity markers such as race class religion citizenship sexuality and marital status have influenced women s lives in the united states for more than 200 years voices of american women s history illustrates that gender alone has never defined women s experiences in america women from diverse backgrounds are represented in media and documents that include pamphlets book excerpts personal narratives photographs advertisements congressional testimonies and supreme court rulings such issues as abortion marriage equality domestic violence and gender parity are shown from historical and contemporary angles as this collection of primary sources allows readers and students to easily trace how women s lives and histories have and continue to intersect with a historical context for each selection the book also features structured activities to help teachers with class discussion and exams including suggestions for further reading document analysis essay questions and manageable research assignments

a brilliantly conceived and provocative work from an award winning historian that examines how seven twentieth century social movements transformed america how do social movements arise wield power and bring about meaningful change renowned scholar linda gordon investigates these and other salient questions in this visionary cautionary timely and utterly necessary book nicole eustace narrating how some of america's most influential twentieth century social movements transformed the nation beginning with the turn of the century settlement house movement the book compares chicago's celebrated hull house begun by privileged women to a much less well known african american project cleveland's phillis wheatley house begun by a former sharecropper expanding her highly praised book the second coming of the kkk the second chapter shows how a northern klan became a mass movement in the 1920s contrary to what many klan opponents thought this kkk was a middle class organization its members primarily urban and well educated in the 1930s the kkk gave birth to dozens of american fascist groups small but extremely violent profiles of two other 1930s movements follow the townsend campaign for old age insurance named for its charismatic leader dr francis townsend it created the public pressure that brought us social security which was considered radical at the time as was the movement to bring about federal unemployment aid for millions proceeding to the 1955 1956 montgomery bus boycott which jump started the career of martin luther king jr the narrative shows how the city's entire black population refused to ride segregated buses initiated by black women their years long hard fought victory inspired the civil rights movement gordon then examines the 1970s farmworkers struggle led by cesar chavez and made possible by the work of tens of

thousands of the primarily mexican american farmworkers together they built the united farm workers union winning better wages and working conditions for some of the country s poorest workers the book concludes with the dramatic stories of two boston socialist feminist groups bread and roses and the combahee river collective which influenced the whole women s liberation movement throughout the work gordon concentrates not on ideologies but on how millions of grassroots activists strategized and changed the united states separately and together these seven narratives bring to life the creativity and hard work of social movements and in doing so reveal how they have been central to american history in stories that reverberate with today s political activism

only by focusing on the similarities as well as the differences in the lives of men and women can we achieve a fully representative portrait however shared experiences and complementary lives of men and women have rarely been considered in historical inquiry this important new anthology reflecting recent trends in the history of men and women calls for the reintegration of the study of gender

contains articles on fashion and style household workers images of women jazz and blues maternity homes native american women phillis wheatley homes picture brides single women and teaching

more than 140 entries in this book depict events which have had lasting national significance in opening opportunities in the struggle for equal civil rights and opportunities for women the impact of many of the included events was initially felt on a local level but in time it created repercussions that spread across the country these stories show women assuming roles of providers and heads of households and their leadership exerted in and outside the home would often manifest in the community at large and in turn in the nation and in the world the book is divided into four parts one the seeds are planted two 19th century the movement takes root three 20th century reaching for the sunlight four 21st century coming into full bloom the book begins with anne hutchinson and mary dyer and ends with condoleezza rice nan

throughout history women have often worked in informal ways and in modest conditions frequently without monuments or grand examples of architecture preserved to commemorate their accomplishments landmarks of american women s history describes the sites that represent a wide variety of women s experiences and accomplishments

a history of the juvenile court movement in america which focuses upon the central but neglected contribution of women reformers the establishment of juvenile courts in cities across the united states was one of the earliest social welfare reforms of the progressive era the first juvenile court law was passed in illinois in 1899 within a decade twenty two other states had passed similar laws based on the illinois example mothers of all children examines this movement focusing especially on the role of women reformers and the importance of gender consciousness in influencing the shape of

reform until recently historians have assumed that male reformers dominated many of the progressive era social reforms mothers of all children goes beyond simply writing women back into the history of the juvenile court movement to reveal the complexity of their involvement some women operated within nineteenth century ideals of motherhood and domesticity while others trained in the social sciences and living in the poor neighborhoods of america s cities took a more pragmatic approach despite these differences clapp finds a common maternalist approach that distinguished women reformers from their male counterparts women were more willing to use the state to deal with wayward children whereas men were more commonly involved as supporters of women reformers initiatives rather than being themselves the initiators of reform firmly located in the context of recent scholarship on american women s history mothers of all children has broad implications for american women s political history and the history of the welfare state

this two volume set examines women s contributions to religious and moral development in america covering individual women their faith related organizations and women s roles and experiences in the broader social and cultural contexts of their times this second edition of encyclopedia of american women and religion provides updated and expanded information from historians and other scholars of religion covering new issues in religion to better describe and document women s roles within religious groups for instance the term evangelical feminism is one newly defined aspect of women s involvement in religious activism changes are constantly occurring within the many religious faiths and denominations in america particularly as women strive to gain positions within religious hierarchies that previously were exclusive to men and rise within their denominations to become theologians church leaders and bishops the entries examine the roles that american women have played in mainstream religious denominations small religious sects and non traditional practices such as witchcraft as well as in groups that question religious beliefs including agnostics and atheists a section containing primary documents gives readers a firsthand look at matters of concern to religious women and their organizations many of these documents are the writings of women who merit entries within the encyclopedia readers will gain an awareness of women s contributions to religious culture in america from the colonial era to the present day and better understand the many challenges that women have faced to achieve success in their religion related endeavors

in this book muncy explains the continuity of white middle class american female reform activity between the progressive era and the new deal she argues that during the progressive era female reformers built an interlocking set of organizations that attempted to control child welfare policy within this policymaking body female progressives professionalized their values bureaucratized their methods and institutionalized their reforming networks to refer to the organizational structure embodying these processes the book develops the original concept of a female dominion in the

otherwise male empire of policymaking at the head of this dominion stood the children's bureau in the federal department of labor muncy investigates the development of the dominion and its particular characteristics such as its monopoly over child welfare and its commitment to public welfare and shows how it was dependent on a peculiarly female professionalism by exploring that process this book illuminates the relationship between professionalization and reform the origins and meaning of progressive reform and the role of gender in creating the american welfare state

during the progressive era over 150 african american women's clubs flourished in chicago through these clubs women created a vibrant social world of their own seeking to achieve social and political uplift by educating themselves and the members of their communities in politics they battled legal discrimination advocated anti lynching laws and fought for suffrage in the tradition of other mothering in which the the community shares in the care and raising of all its children the club women established kindergartens youth clubs and homes for the elderly in toward a tenderer humanity and a nobler womanhood anne meis knupfer documents how the club women created multiple allegiances through social and club networks and sheds light on the life experiences of african american women in urban centers throughout the country drawing upon the primary documents of african american newspapers journals and speeches of the time this book chronicles and analyzes the complexity and richness of the african american club women's lives as they lifted while others climbed

instead the nation nearly became a unique maternalist welfare state as the federal government and more than forty states enacted social spending labor regulations and health education programs to assist american mothers and children remarkably as skocpol shows many of these policies were enacted even before american women were granted the right to vote banned from electoral politics they turned their energies to creating huge nation spanning federations of local women's clubs which collaborated with reform minded professional women to spur legislative action across the country

this four volume set documents the complexity and richness of women's contributions to american history and culture empowering all students by demonstrating a more populist approach to the past based on the content of most textbooks it would be easy to reach the erroneous conclusion that women have not contributed much to america's history and development nothing could be further from the truth offering comprehensive coverage of women of a diverse range of cultures classes ethnicities religions and sexual identifications this four volume set identifies the many ways in which women have helped to shape and strengthen the united states this encyclopedia is organized into four chronological volumes with each volume further divided into three sections each section features an overview essay and thematic essay as well as detailed entries on topics ranging from lady gaga to ladybird johnson lucy stone and lucille ball and from the international ladies of rhythm

to the international ladies garment workers union the set also includes a vast variety of primary documents such as personal letters public papers newspaper articles recipes and more these primary documents enhance users learning opportunities and enable readers to better connect with the subject matter
